Your name will also be entered in the rural "Roll of Honour", but no details will be disclosed to any Third Party.

The importance of any Exemption being open to scrutiny by a Third Party cannot be overstated.

Hunting Report

For "Boxing Day 2000"

As usual a large crowd turned out for the "Boxing Day Meet at the QUEENS HEAD, LANCHESTER, in spite of the hard frost. After some local hunting around Boggle Hole in the morning, hounds were taken to George Tomlinson's wood at Sunnyside where a fox was quickly away from the top end of the wood towards Knitsley, - turning to the left he crossed the road and made straight for Woodlands Hall. Hounds were brought to their noses in the plough, but persevered past the Hall to cross Longedge Lane and into Sawmill Wood. Here our fox had paused in the young plantation and hounds soon had him back on his feet to run the length of the wood. Turning back over Longedge he made for Humber House. Changing his course he crossed the Humber Hill Lane to run behind the buildings at Cole Pike and Hollinside Farms, before dropping down to Lanchester Dairies and following the Hill to Fox Hills plantations.

These hounds changed foxes as the hunted fox was seen crossing back over the Humber Hill Lane above Donely Ford. However, by now hounds were away with a fresh fox down to the Smallhope Burn, and up past Hurbuck Farm and down into Stockerly Burn, where they were stopped in failing light - 7 miles as hounds ran.

WEDNESDAY 17th JANUARY - THE "PAVILLION", IVESTON - Many thanks to our Host Kim and his assistants for another super "Pavillion" Meet. - Hounds were taken first to Boggle Hole where they got away almost immediately from the top end of the cover, and after some fast hunting up towards Crookhall, during which he just tried to cross the Iveston Road, and then the dual carriage way, hounds were stopped in the vicinity of Crookhall Farm.

In the afternoon, hounds were taken to Stoney Heap where a fox from the rushes broke towards Greencroft, passing through Hanging Stone Covert he crossed the road and made straight for George Herdman's Whins where he went to ground and was accounted for. - From here hounds were taken back to Stoney Heap and our next fox broke to the West, crossing the East Castle Lane and Brooms Lane towards Iveston - he altered his course to the right and passing close to Low Brooms Farm, back over Brooms Lane to the back of the Church.

Here he crossed the railway line and up and over the Main Stanley Road. By now hounds were flying as they crossed over Pontop Fell behind the Mast and Pontop Pike Farm. He then headed towards Arnfield Plain before crossing back over the main road, back into Stoney Heap and out again to the West. Hounds were stopped at the back of Brooms Church as it looked as if our pilot had again crossed the main road. "BILLY ROW"

'Braes' Hounds met at Castleside on 20th December 2000, however it may be of interest to readers of "Braes News" of two hunts nearly 140 years ago!

The Delights of the Chase:


"The Castleside Hounds" often referred to as the "Castleside Dogs" were established about 1847 and continued for about ten years, and throughout its life was under the Mastership of Mr J B Richardson of Woodlands, Near Knitsley, who was incidentally, an uncle of Lewis Priestman, later to be Master of the Braes of Derwent. The Castleside pack was originally formed from a draft from the Duke of Cleveland's Kennels for the purpose of hunting the roe deer which, then, as now, were numerous in the district. The stronghold of the deer at that time was the large block of woodland known as the Marquis of Bute's Plantations, all of which were felled during the 1914-18 War.

Hunting the roe deer, however, did not meet with much success, and Mr Richardson very soon turned his attention to hunting the fox and occasionally the hare. The huntsman of the Castleside Dogs, during this time was known to all as Jos. Kirk, a blacksmith by trade and in business in the village. He was described as being one of the roughest, yet one of the keenest men ever to be a professional huntsman. Tall, spindle-shanked, and inclining to be bald, with sharp-featured, weather-beaten face, he put everything into each pursuit of Reynard:-

"Three times she bolted for the Sneeep,
Three times she swam the Derwent Deep,
Jossie Kirk in his clogs, beat both
men, horses and dogs."

Two Hunts with the Castleside pack are worth mentioning. The first one, - hounds found in the Sneeep, running up the Derwent Valley to Espershields, bearing north to Slatley, crossing Devil's Water at Duke's House. At this point hounds had a considerable check in a garden. Jos. Kirk went into the garden and on encountering the owner, a stormy scene ensued and blows were struck!

However, the fox was viewed again going away from Hexham, Kirk quickly left off battle, and the fox was chased back to the Sneepe, and completed two points on each way of eleven miles.

The Second hunt of note was in 1856-57. After the meet at Shotley Lodge hounds found in Whiteside Plantation, and the fox headed for Berry Edge, Bunker Hill and on to Boggle Hole, then by Lanchester and Hamsteels to Hilltop. Eventually hounds got up to their fox and ran at a cracking pace practically into Durham City, killing their fox at Western Hill, ½ mile from the Cathedral, making a point of twelve miles.

One wonders, will we ever see any more chases like it?

THE END OF AN ERA

Sadly, during the last few weeks, we have lost two of the most ardent supporters of our noble sport, Fox Hunting.

Derek Franks and Rob Graham were very great friends, and for many years travelled the length and breadth of the North of England in pursuit of their favourite pastime, Hunting.

During the winter months they followed the Braes, and on the days the Braes were 'nt hunting, or if they were at an unpopular area, they could be found following the Border, Haydon, North Tyne or the Tynedale hounds.

During the summer months they followed the Otter Hounds, and more laterly the Mink Hounds. Rob, particularly hated snowchops as they signalled to him the end of the Fox Hunting Season!

Derek, who for many years was Caretaker at Chopwell Junior School, died, after apparently making a good recovery after an operation. He loved hunting, his pigeons and until recently his terriers. He was very well known and respected throughout the hunting world, particularly in the North of England, and we have lost a great and faithful supporter of our sport. He had a great sense of humour and it was always a pleasure to be in his company.

Rob, who was our oldest Member of the Supporters Club, was in his 93rd year when he passed away. Born in Blackhall Mill he had been taken by his mother hunting when he was three years old and continued to follow hounds, either on foot or by car for the rest of his life. He had worked as a miner all his working years and shift work enabled him to follow his favourite pastime regularly. His stories and tales of past years will long be remembered and there can't be many square yards of our countryside which he hasn't walked at sometime or other. During the last year or two, those who have been in his company noticed his eyes and ears were not what they used to be! but he still enjoyed going hunting as he loved the friendships and fresh air.

He had a great sense of humour and a very quick wit - one of my favourite memories is the day he met, as he recalled, "A well dressed woman in a big car". She said to him as he approached the Post Office in Ebchester "I'm lost, and I'm doing my best to get to the Crematorium". He quickly replied, "Missus, I'm doing my best to keep out of the b....r!!"

They 'broke the mould' they day Rob was born, as I doubt if there will ever be another character like him.

When thinking about Derek and Rob, and the hours I enjoyed in their company, I recall the words of the First World War Poet, Laurence Binyon - he said:-

"They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old.

Age shall not weary them, or the years condemn.

At the going down of the sun and in the morning,

we will remember them"


